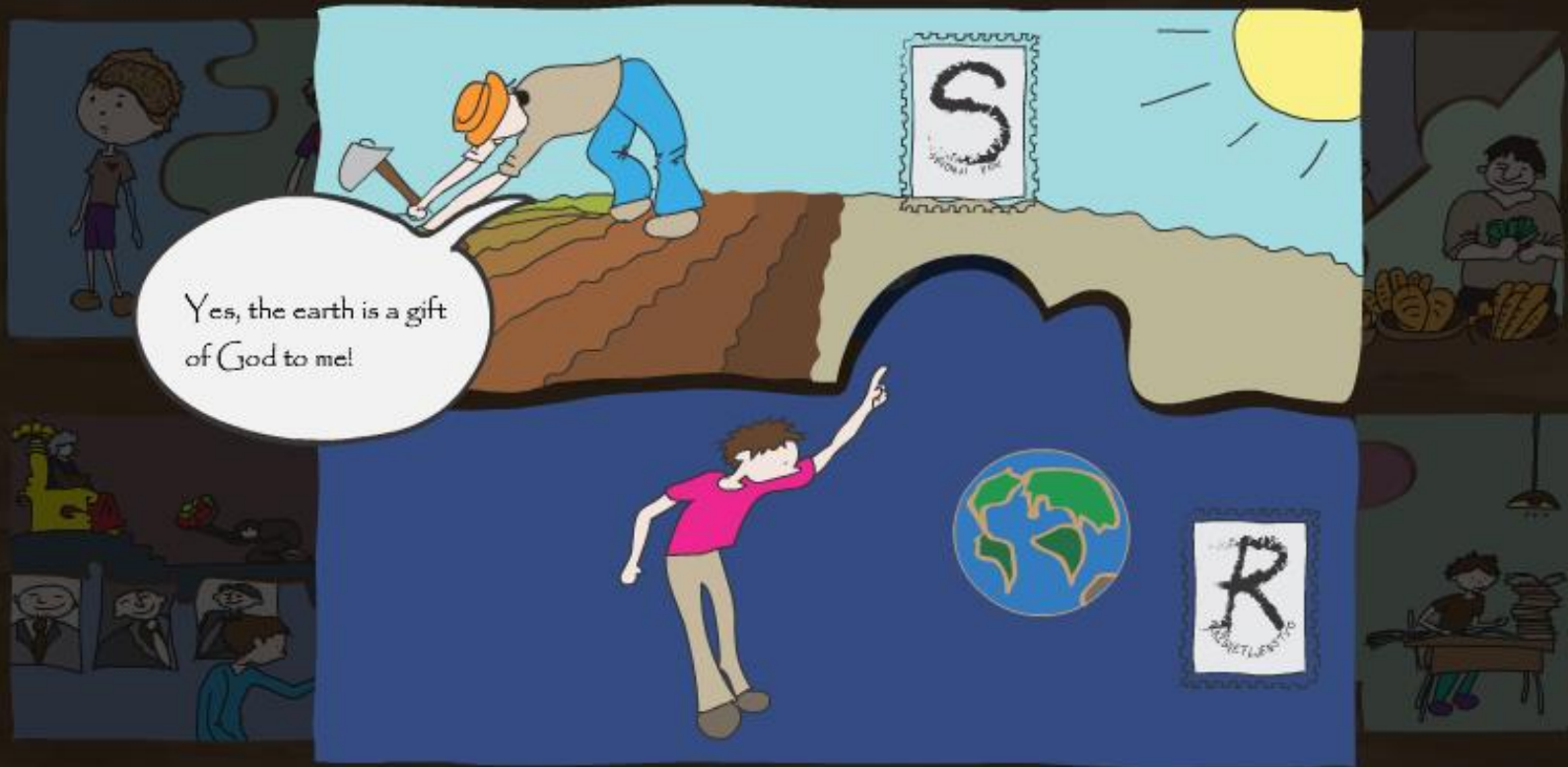

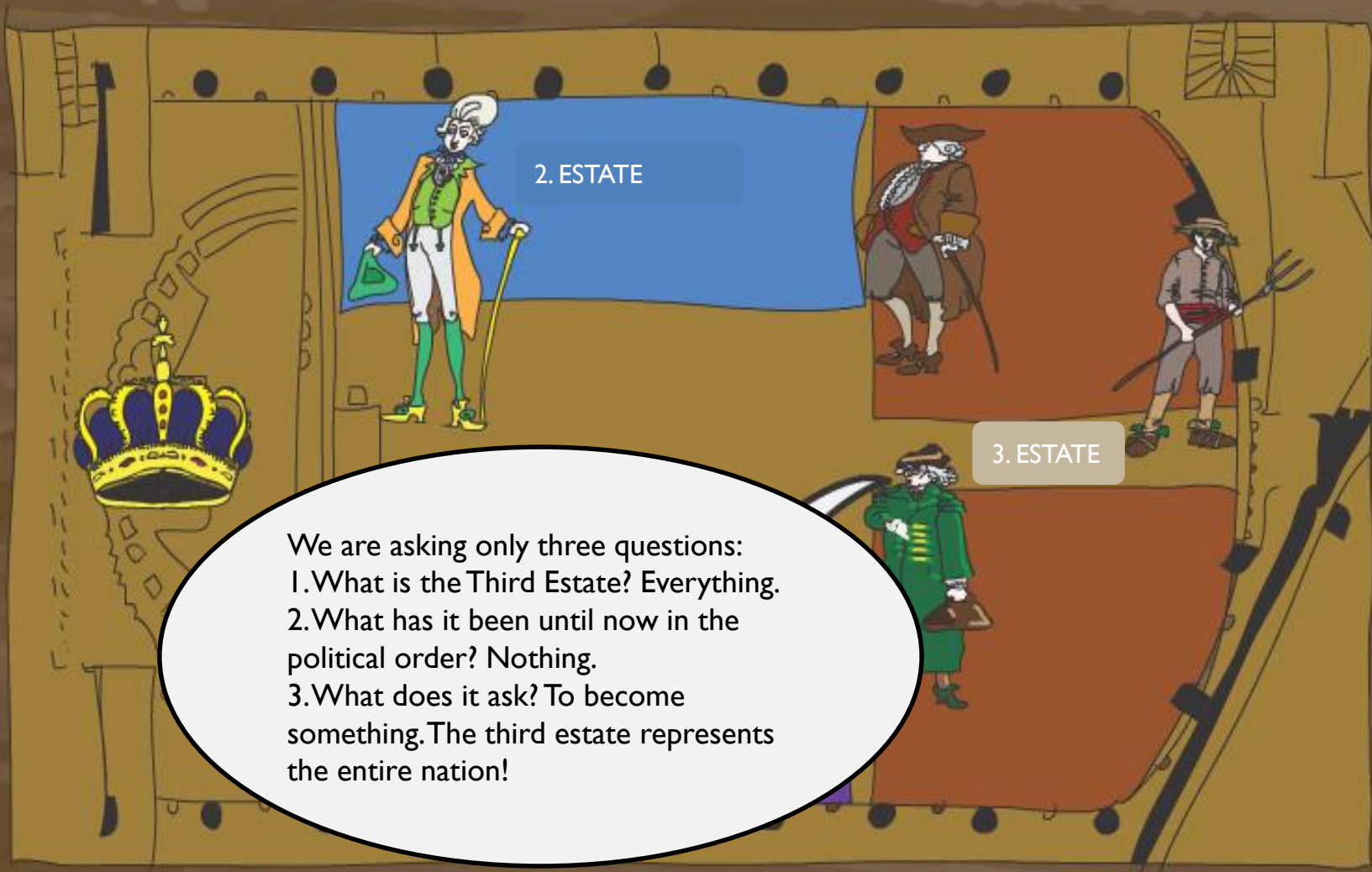

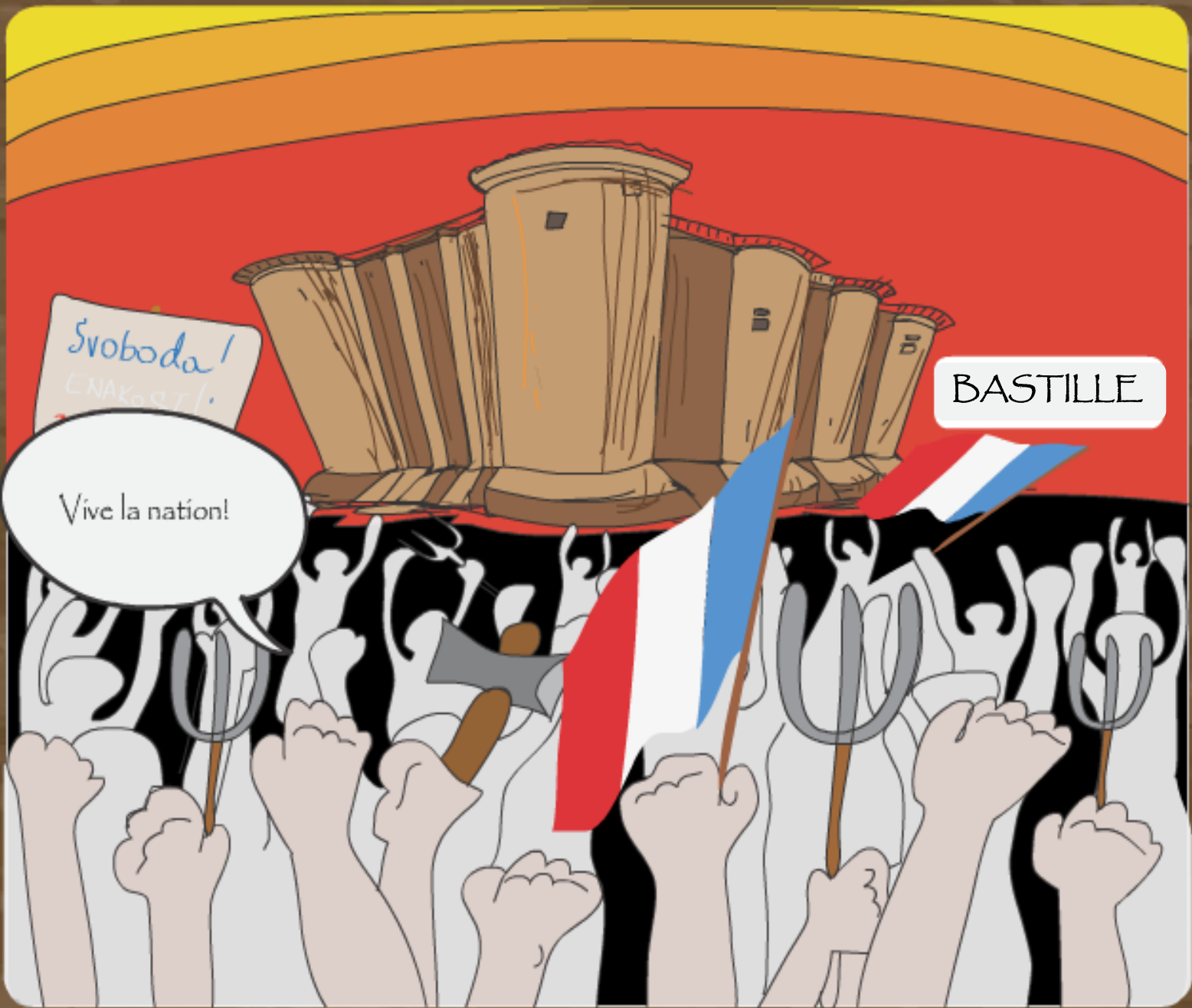

Republic



It is a form of government in which the people or their elected representatives possess the supreme power.

Monarchy



It is a form of governance reigned by a king, queen or an emperor.

The crown is passed from one generation to another.
